PTO Statement on Black Lives Matter

The PTO Board believes that Black Lives Matter and stands in solidarity with those calling to dismantle oppressive systems that perpetuate racism and injustice in our communities, including in our schools. We call on you to join us in an ongoing and important dialogue about race and racism in our own Longfellow Community and lend your support to our commitment to develop better strategies to close the Achievement and Discipline Gaps that currently exist. Our black families, children, and staff deserve centering in our conversations, event-planning, and goal-setting to become a more welcoming home. It is our intention to build a better Longfellow by ensuring the voices of all stake-holders are heard and honored.
